What a fantastic year 2018 has been for our charity!

We are extremely privileged to have been supported by some amazing people, they have helped us to raise awareness as well as save lives!

Heart Screenings Review for 2018

We have now screened 2277 people, we screened our 2000th person in June!

We have identified 15 young people with serious life-threatening issues!

During 2018 we have screened just over 500 young people:

8 of those young people were referred for further heart related tests,

17 were referred back to their GP for other serious issues

25 were referred back to their GP for blood pressure issues

One of those people referred for further heart related tests was diagnosed with a serious case of Cardiomyopathy and has since had an implantable cardioverter-defbrillator (ICD) fitted.

Together with your help, we really are making a huge difference to people's lives!

Heart Screening Update from September to December 2018

Since our last newsletter, this is what's been happening with our FREE heart screenings.



On 20th October 2018 we held our annual FREE heart screening at Everton FC Community Hub. We screened 96 young people. Out of those - 3 people needed to be referred for further tests, 6 people were advised to see their GP for other issues and 6 people were given blood pressure/lifestyle advice. We gave a lot of people peace of mind with regard to their heart health.

On 24th November 2018 at Macdonald Portal Hotel, Golf & Spa in Tarporley. The event was funded by Myles Carr and the guys at Little Tap, as well as lots of fantastic people from Tarporley. 99 people were screened and the majority went away with smiles on their faces, having had their heart checked and been told all was well.

There were a number that were referred for further tests.



In the time you have read this, another young person will have collapsed and died from a Sudden Cardiac Arrest and another family's life will be changed forever!

Please help the VSF raise funds to provide more FREE heart screenings.

The next young death could be your son, daughter, friend or work colleague!




Fancy a Challenge?
